Accessing your Te Rito Maioha course readings

You can Access your readings via the library catalogue link in your course which takes you to a list of all your readings within the Open Polytechnic Library website. Most of these are listed in alphabetical order by author surname. However, not all appear in order. The FAQs below will help you locate any readings you can't see easily.

How do I access my course readings?

From your course (within your learning platform Pou Manawa Akoranga) click on the link called **Library Catalogue for...**

Here is an example from the course TIP3:



This will take you to all your course readings within the Open Polytechnic Library Catalogue.

These are in alphabetical order by author surname*, e.g.:



^{*}Note, not all your readings will be listed in order by author. See What if I can't see a particular reading?

What if I can't see a particular reading?


If you can't spot a reading by its author, scroll down the list, looking for the reading's **title** (if you don't have the title, see: How do I find the title for a reading?)

E.g. if you're looking for this TIP3 reading:

You won't see it listed under 'E' for Education Review Office:




If you scroll down, you'll find it further down the list (some readings do not have an author field, they might be a corporate author or have editors instead):



How do I find the title for a reading?

If you've been directed to a reading, but have only been given the author and year, e.g. "Croft, 2017", you will find the full details for all your readings within your course outline. Click on the **Course Oultline** link within your course, e.g.



At the end of the outline is a list of all your readings, where you'll find full details.

Note some readings may be **chapters** within an edited book. See <u>I've tried searching by title and I still can't</u> find it, why?:

I've tried searching by title and I still can't find it, why?

The reading may be a **chapter within an edited book** (where each chapter has a different author). In that case, you need to search for the **book** title, rather than the **chapter** author or title.

For example:


You can see the ECE1 reading below by Tagoilelagi-Leota has:

A chapter title, and a book title



When running your eye down the catalogue link to all ECE1 readings, you won't find the reading listed under the chapter author, Tagoilelagi-Leota, or the chapter title, Fa'alelegappepe...

Instead, scroll down to find the **book title**, Āta kitea te pae - scanning the horizons.



When you click through to the book's full record, you should see the chapter title and author listed:



If you want to see if your reading is a chapter within an edited book, follow the steps in

Can I search for a reading directly in the Library?

Yes, if you can't find a particular reading via the course link to readings, you can search for it directly in our library website:

For example, if you were looking for this reading:

Here are the steps you would take:

From your learning platform, click on Ngā hononga/Useful Links:




• Click on Whare Pukapuka/Library:



This will take you to our library website.

• Click on Catalogue and enter keywords from the title and/or authors' surnames



• The reading should* appear in the results.
